Naiomi is from the Listuguj Mi'gmaq First Nation, located on the Gaspé Coast of Quebec. Admitted to the Bar on March 7th, 2008, she was the first Nova Scotia

lawyer in history to be called to the Bar in English, French and Mi'kmaq. *Naiomi is a member, supporter and volunteer with LEAF.* She currently serves on the Law Program Committee of the National Board.

The Annual Halifax LEAF Persons Day Breakfast celebrates the landmark 1929 "Persons Case" that guaranteed women the right to participate in all aspects of public life in Canada. This Persons Day, show your support for LEAF!
